T = Thanksgiving - Philippians 4:6

S = Supplication - 1 Timothy 2:1

- Everywhere 1 Timothy 2:8
- In the closet (secret place) Matthew 6:6
- In the temple Luke 18:10, Psalm 26:12,

Private prayer is made in the secret place.

Family prayer is made with a small group.

Public prayer is made before the congregation.

### 2. When to pray

- Always Luke 18:1, 1 Thessalonians 5:17
- In the morning Psalm 5:3
- At noon and in the evening Psalm 55:17
- Daily Psalm 86:3
- Day and night Psalm 88:1

Daniel prayed three times a day (Daniel 6:10)

- Forgive others before God will hear and answer our prayers Mark 11:25
- Pray in faith believing Mark 11:24, James 1:6-7
- Keep His commandments 1 John 3:22
- Abide in Christ John 15:7
- Pray in the Holy Ghost Jude 20
- Pray in Jesus' name John 16:24

### Conclusion

- God gives one of three answers to prayer:
   (1) Yes, (2) No, (3) Wait.
- Isaiah 65:24 "And it shall come to pass, that before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear."
- The one **prayer of a sinner** that God promises to hear is, Luke 18:13 "God be merciful to me a sinner." See also II Pet. 3:9.
